### TRIBE: LOOP 101 GROWTH WILL BE DELIBERATE

Development along the Loop 101 corridor will occur deliberately and with an eye on future generations, managers from the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community told a Scottsdale Leadership forum Wednesday.

The tribe's processes take into account cultural values, connections to the land and U.S. laws governing leasing trust land, they said.

And while the community's 18- to 20-month approval process seems long to some, relationships between Scottsdale and the Indian community have improved dramatically in recent years, Scottsdale and tribal officials said.

The community continues to expand its Chaparral Business Center at Chaparral Road and the 101, said Ken Duncan, project coordinator for Salt River Devco.

Though it has received a lot of outside interest, the community has no plans to add residential development along the 101, Duncan said.

Representatives from both sides of the 101 spoke at Scottsdale Leadership's Economic Development Forum.
